About the role

We're looking for engaging and confident interviewers who are comfortable speaking to people and are good at getting a great story out of someone. We would also like you to conduct online recorded interviews with 10 shortlisted nominees prior to the event that will be used in video content on the night.

This role would involve virtually meeting and speaking with shortlisted nominees for certain awards and carrying out some of the following tasks.

- Interviewing them about their involvement with Youth Music and their nomination.
- Bringing your own style to asking questions that feel natural to you.

 Making the nominees feel comfortable and asking questions that allow their personalities to shine through.

You'll bring energy, enthusiasm, and professionalism to every take. Viewers will see your personal passion for music, and your belief in its power to change young people's lives.

We're looking for someone who can speak confidently with young people and music leaders and make them feel comfortable being interviewed on camera. The successful applicant will be fully briefed on our campaign story, then bring this to life in their interviews.

This is a freelance contract role for someone seeking paid experience to build a career in the music industries.

• **July:** Read up on and interview 10 shortlisted nominees (30 mins each) via zoom. These will be used as award content for before, during and after the event.

Youth Music aims to support young people in the early stages of developing creative careers, therefore we would particularly like to encourage applications from those aged 25 or under.

We value all kinds of experience and want to engage people from a variety of backgrounds. We are keen to diversify our team and are currently underrepresented by Disabled and neurodivergent people, people from Black, Asian and minority ethnic backgrounds, and members of the LGBTQ+ community.

Data Protection
