Mackenzie been stepping into leadership roles since they were 10 years old. From teaching martial arts to other young people to volunteering with Scouts, they have also qualified as a First Aider with St John Ambulance. After battling mental health challenges, they volunteer at The Music Works as a Music Leader, where they build confidence and support young people to overcome barriers.

Toni Olabanji (he/him) Rap Club Productions C.I.C, London

Toni (aka TSTIZZ) is a rapper, actor and youth leader. Having led performances to thousands at the Royal Albert Hall and Trafalgar Square, he's gone viral on TikTok both individually and as Associate Director of the Spit Game collective, alongside pursuing acting and film production. Toni also runs rap clubs in and outside of schools across London, representing and developing the potential within his communities.







Original Track Award (Solo)

Aaron Akpojaro's (aka Cures and Curses) sound cuts an alternative edge with an unapologetic mainstream polish. "Harder Drugs" is a hard-hitting rock anthem that traces the lines between personal and political, capturing the frustration of young people feeling like their prospects are slipping away. It reflects a generation facing a bleak future, critiquing social and economic barriers, and expressing a deep yearning for escapism during challenging times.





LVRA (she/they) - Anxiety Sound of Young Scotland Award / Youth Music NextGen Fund. Scotland


Anthemic and experimental, Edinburgh-born LVRA's music has become one of the most singular voices in progressive electronic music. Written and produced by LVRA, aka Rachel Lu, "Anxiety" speaks about the experience of being an overthinker. The song was created from LVRA's desire to live and accept that part of themselves.

Meduulla (she/her) – Limbo feat. The Mouse Outfit

NextGen Fund, North West

Zimbabwean-born, Manchester-based rapper, poet and DJ Meduulla marries her modern flows and witty lyrics with jazz-inspired hip-hop instrumentals to create music that reflects the present day whilst carrying a nostalgic air. As a first generation immigrant, the song discusses the conflict of loving both your place of birth and place of residence when the two places have a complex history.





Sarah Isabella (she/her) - Intuition

Youth Music NextGen Fund, London

Sarah Isabella's velvety vocals and conversational lyricism marries a sound that travels between ambient soul, alt RnB and jazz, "Intuition" sees a collaboration with producer Tolu Shorts and was written during a period of turmoil for Isabella. The song is deeply meaningful to Isabella as it marks a pivotal step toward the artist she wanted to become.

Thabo Mkwananzi (he/him)

Finding Rhythms, London

Thabo is a singer from Zimbabwe who is drawn to making music that educates, entertains and empowers the listener. From singing in church to joining a hip-hop/soul band, he has released three solo EPs, toured with artists like Seal and collaborated on music with Idris Elba and Naughty Boy. Thabo is passionate about helping young people in the justice system discover and develop their own artistic expression.

Vanessa Maria is a DJ, broadcaster at KISS FM, and Resident Advisor host. She received the Limitless Black Influence Award 2023 and featured in the GUAP 30 Under 30 Blacklist 2023. Her unique blend of underground UK music captivates audiences worldwide, infusing sounds from diverse cultures with UK Club classics.

Lyricist Award

Sponsored by PRS for Music

For outstanding lyrics in an original track by an artist or group involved in a Youth Music-funded project.

PRS for Music is a world-leading music collective management organisation representing the rights of more than 165,000 talented songwriters, composers and music publishers around the globe. Headquartered in the UK, it works diligently on behalf of its members to grow and protect the value of their rights. With a focus on innovation and integrity, PRS for Music is redefining the global standard for music royalties to ensure creators are paid whenever their musical compositions and songs are streamed, downloaded, broadcast, performed and played in public. In 2022, PRS for Music collected £964m and paid out £836.2m in royalties.



C4Truth (he/him) – Controversial

C4Truth leverages his emotions and the pain of his past experiences to tell his story. On "Controversial", he discusses multiple world issues currently occurring such as the Israel-Gaza conflict and knife crime in south London. The song aims to unite communities, for everyone to grasp a better understanding on the currents matter taking place around us.

Noah Bouchard (he/him) – Dad's Clothes

Youth Music NextGen Fund, Wales

Welsh hip-hop artist Noah Bouchard's introspective lyrics focus on tales of vulnerability. His debut album 'Love Of My Life' (2024) explores themes of self-acceptance and forgiveness. "Dad's Clothes" is one of the most personal songs on Noah's album and details three generations of trauma and the way each processed it.





Siteng (she/her) – Broken (Home is my Prison)

Youth Music NextGen Fund, London

Siteng is a London-based artist from China, known for her atmospheric art pop. Her music explores themes of the feminine psyche, violence, and transcendence, accompanied by self-directed visuals. Her track "Broken (Home Is My Prison)" addresses exile and silencing in both Chinese and English.






Music Producer Award

Tsatsamis (he/him)


Youth Music NextGen Fund, London

Founded in 2015, Girls Rock London is an award-winning charity empowering girls, women, trans, and non-binary people through music. By creating supportive spaces, they help participants learn instruments, form bands, and write original songs, fostering confidence and self-expression. They offer peer learning, professional development, and community-building opportunities.

The Spit Game
Rap Club Productions C.I.C., London

The first rap club took place in a detention when teacher Benjamin Turner asked a student, "what kind of music do you like?". Since then, the community has grown into a collective of talent spread across London, some signed to record labels, some in non-performing roles, kickstarting careers across music and film, a production house embedded with youth work, running Rap Clubs just like the first one all across London.



Soft Touch StudiosSoft Touch Arts, East Midlands

Soft Touch Arts uses music and the arts to create opportunity, change and to make young people's quality of life better. They believe music is for all, regardless of ability, background, gender or situation. Young people connect with a community of creative musicians who are experts across many genres and who share one common aim: a desire to share this expertise with help young people to help them develop as musicians and people.

The Coventry-based project participants collaborated in the studio, exchanging ideas with Detroit for lyrics and input, going through several sessions over a few months before finalising the track.




When the Lights Come On - Whine

Finding Rhythms, London

"Whine" was written and recorded by young residents of YMCA LandAid House as part of the album 'When The Lights Come On.' Produced through Finding Rhythms, a music charity empowering lives, participants spent six weeks working with professional musicians to create original tracks, regardless of their musical experience.

Lucky Iris – blowing kisses Music Local, Yorkshire & The Humber

Lucky Iris - composed of songwriting and production duo Maeve and Jasper - make music to dance or cry to as they tread through lessons learnt in love and friendships. Part of their EP, 'maybe i'm too much', "blowing kisses" explores how exposing and exciting it is to let yourself fall for someone.





TL & Chiraq – B4B Rap Club Productions C.I.C, London

Core members of The Spit Game collective, TL and Chiraq's "B4B" sees the pair go "Bar 4 Bar", trading intense verses and highlighting their lyrical prowess. Created during a late-night studio session with Chiraq, TL, and producer Impho, the track focuses on wordplay and delivery, allowing each rapper to shine. It has gained momentum across social media, and a music video is in the works.

Pop Vulture – BlisterCome Play With Me. Yorkshire & The Humber

Pop Vulture's track "Blister" merges No-Wave dissonance and post-punk grooves with stream-of-consciousness lyrics about mental health and modern life's pressures. The unsettled time signature and driving vocals keep listeners on edge, while a prominent viola line adds depth. The track explores a new sonic direction for the band

JR Graham, or 4 The Brotherhood, is a Filipino/Jamaican indie-pop artist, producer and songwriter from South-West London whose music has received support from Wonderland and DMY magazines. The "Adrenaline Rush" video captures his chaotic lifestyle, likened to the thrill of a rollercoaster drop or skydiving. Filmed in London over two days, JR enlisted talented friends for casting and set.

LVRA (she/they) - Venom (feat. Spent) The Sound of Young Scotland Award / Youth Music NextGen Fund, Scotland

Part of LVRA's 'soft like steel' project, the song exploring beauty and identity. Shot in Glasgow on a tight budget, it shows a character shedding a second-skin costume, symbolising rebirth. The video reflects LVRA's personal journey of exploring queerness and individuality.






Meduulla (she/her) – Limbo feat. The Mouse Outfit

"Limbo" celebrates migrants, travellers, and nomads, honouring those who feel conflicted about where to call home, real or imagined.

Peri Rae's guitar and vocal-driven indie-rock songs chronicle her life and how she views the world around her. Peri draws inspiration from the ocean, reflecting its healing power. This video, filmed in Cornwall, is a love letter to her new home, featuring friends as cast and their businesses as locations. A DIY project, it mirrors Peri's life's journey, building from sadness to something epic.



Sarah Isabella (she/her) - Intuition Youth Music NextGen Fund, London

A singer and songwriter from East London, Sarah Isabella blends ambient soul, alternative R&B, jazz and hip-hop. As a co-director of the music video, Sarah shot across London, forests, and worked with vases for illusionary effects. Setbacks such as lost footage gave an opportunity to refine the video, and support from friends in styling, locations and lighting ensured it was full of heart.



Having been publicly open with his own struggles surrounding mental health, Jordan has been very active in creating awareness around the stigma. His mental health campaign #IAMWHOLE reached over 120 million people online and was mentioned in the Houses of Parliament. His children's book, The Missing Piece was recently shortlisted for the Waterstones Children's Prize. His new book Avoidance, Drugs, Heartbreak and Dogs was released in August 2024 and went straight in as a Sunday Times Best Seller.

IN MEMORIAM

This year, we'd like to honour the lives and legacies of four people who made enormous contributions to music and the lives of countless young people.



Graham Dowdall

Graham Dowdall was an inspiring figure in community music, known for his integrity and dedication to young people. Over three decades, he worked with Youth Music-funded partners, including Sound Connections and Surrey Arts, and pioneered the use of music technology in inclusive settings. At Goldsmiths College, he was the go-to person for community music, always focused on inclusion and justice. Graham's work empowered excluded and neurodivergent youth, leaving a lasting legacy through the lives he touched and the practices he developed. He will be missed but never forgotten.

Lyndall Rosewarne

Lyndall Rosewarne was a pioneering force in musical inclusion in England. Starting at Youth Music in 2003, she developed key partnerships to bring music where it was most needed. Later, at MusicNet East, she championed local ownership and collaboration with Music Education Hubs. In 2019, she co-founded Magic Acorns CIC, which became a leader in early years music practices. Though she never sought recognition, Lyndall became an inspirational figure, dedicating her career to improving music opportunities for young people. Her legacy continues to guide colleagues who often ask, "What would Lyndall do?"





Sam Malik

Sam Malik, a visionary in music and the creative industries, made a lasting impact nationally and internationally. With 15 years of experience in arts, media, and youth sectors, he collaborated with artists, studios, theatres, and communities. Malik's agency, SM Music MGMT, drove new music initiatives in Manchester until his passing in 2024. Passionate about charity, he co-owned a restaurant providing free meals during COVID-19 and supported the homeless. Malik's legacy of compassion, mentorship, and service continues to inspire those who knew him.

Tony Haynes

Tony co-founded Grand Union Orchestra in 1982 and was its Composer and Creative Director for over 40 years. Thanks to Tony's vision and determination, Grand Union Orchestra has always been a multicultural group featuring musicians from all over the world, many of whom are first-generation migrants living in London. Tony co-founded it to reflect the UK's changing cultural landscape and to create a creative, safe and supportive space for emerging musicians from diverse backgrounds to collaborate with top level jazz players. Tony was a tireless campaigner for the importance of music in young people's lives and set up Grand Union Youth Orchestra in 2007, which was supported by Youth Music.
